MINISTER'S MESSAGE CONT...

I would like to state that it is a top priority of the new government led by the President to develop the infrastructure of the estate community, especially the Malayagam community, and to provide them with the human rights that they have inherited but have been deprived of so far.

I am extremely happy that the initial work has already begun through the Ministry of Plantations and Community Infrastructure, making the dream of the estate community to own a house with their own land, which has been a dream until now, a reality. Construction of ten thousand houses, which will be built with financial support from the Indian Government and the new government, has now been able to commence. It is a matter of joy that during the recent discussion with the Indian High Commissioner, Hon. Santosh Jha, he expressed his willingness to provide full support to complete the work on those houses expeditiously and provide them to the estate community, and to further assist in developing the infrastructure of the estate community in the future. We plan to hand over 6,000 houses to the public this year, including those currently under construction, to provide housing to community displaced by disasters, and we are ready to complete work on another 4,000 houses in 2026.

The construction of 51 houses under the Kabaragala Housing Scheme has already begun for community who have been living in displacement camps with their children for years due to landslides. The program to provide smart classrooms to 60 plantation-related schools with assistance from the Indian government to enhance children's education is also a unique work that took place in this regard.

Special nutrition programs will also be implemented in the future to improve the nutrition of estate preschool children. It is also gratifying that all necessary arrangements are currently being made to renovate and provide houses to 1072 families in 75 line rooms under the Clean Sri Lanka program. The rights of the Malayagam plantation community are being continuously provided in line with the Hatton Declaration made by President Anura Kumara Dissanayake in Hatton to mark the 200th anniversary of the arrival of the Malayagam plantation community in this country. Instead of providing housing based on political affiliations, housing should be made available to all estate communities in need. I believe it is the grave responsibility of President Anura Kumara Dissanayake to ensure that the Malayagam estate community in our country has access to a prosperous nation and a better quality of life.

Water Testing Laboratory at PHDT office of Nuwara eliya

PHDT Water testing Laboratory at Nuwara Eliya is equipped with state-of-the-art equipment and following strict protocols to provide high standard quality testing facilities to provide accurate and reliable results in order to ensure the safety and quality of water for consumption.

The laboratory services comprised of microbiological testing, including the detection of E. coli and coliform bacteria, which are critical indicators of water contamination by human excreta. Additionally, the laboratory perform physical-chemical tests to measure parameters such as pH, turbidity, and chemical contaminants, ensuring that the water meets the highest safety standards for drinking water.

The Ray of Hope English classes for plantation and tea smallholder communities were initiated following our Director General's study tour to India's plantations. During this visit, the idea emerged to modernize English education for children in plantations by incorporating Smart Board technology instead of traditional blackboards.

The Plantation Human Development Trust (PHDT) developed this model to provide informal English language lessons to children in Regional Plantation Companies (RPCs) and tea smallholder communities. This initiative aims to improve students' listening, writing, and speaking skills while fostering personal development.

Although the literacy rate among plantation children has risen from 40% in 1992 to 80% today, English literacy remains low, at only 3-4%.

In collaboration with the CTTCT, the charitable arm of the Ceylon Tea Traders Association (CTTA), a pilot project was launched at three centers:

- PHDT Regional Office Galle
- PHDT Regional Office Ratnapura
- Craighead Estate, Kahawatta Plantations – Kandy

Currently, 105 students from Grades 1–8 are enrolled in these programs.

Since June 2024, PHDT has been managing and monitoring these centers. The program has gained significant popularity, benefiting the children attending these classes. Regular assessments are conducted by teachers with the support of regional directors, staff, and the PHDT head office.

"RAY OF HOPE" AT Craighead estate Kandy region

CTTCT and PHDT collaborated to start a project called Ray of HOPE Smart Class Room for a period of one year for 35 children of 6,7,8 grades to develop the English knowledge of the plantation children and to develop their knowledge. Accordingly, we have selected and started this project on Craighead Estate belonging Kahawatta Plantation to Company, among the 06 plantation companies in our region. For this, cost of approximately 1,528,005.00 rupees have been spent on equipment and another 104,010.00 monthly acquired on refreshment, Teacher's salary etc..

ENHANCING LIVING STANDARDS IN ESTATE SECTORS ACROSS SEVEN REGIONS



The PHDT Engineering Division has completed a wide range of estate housing and infrastructure development activities in 2024, including water projects to provide safe drinking water, electricity connections for individual housing units, and reroofing programs for severely damaged and dilapidated line rooms. These initiatives have significantly contributed to enhancing the living standards of estate workers across seven regions: Galle, Ratnapura, Badulla, Kegalle, Kandy, Nuwara Eliva, and Hatton.

HOUSING CONSTRUCTION AND INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT

Throughout 2024, our team has been actively involved in completing the balance work of partially constructed housing units and upgrading existing and new infrastructure to improve the quality of life for estate workers and their families. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, which affected Sri Lanka from mid-2020 to the end of 2022, several projects involving 1,009 housing units came to a standstill. Following the subsequent economic crisis. 329 housing units were approved for completion by the Ministry of Plantation and Community Infrastructure, with an allocation of 307 million rupees and additional 94.3 million rupees for housing infrastructure water.

Additionally, 397 housing units remain to be completed, with plans to finalize these projects in 2025. An allocation of 518.6 million rupees has been proposed for this purpose. In addition to housing construction, we have undertaken several re-roofing projects to restore line rooms severely damaged by fire, wind, or age-related deterioration. These efforts have ensured safer and more resilient living conditions for affected families.

Under the 2024 re-roofing program, 135 units of damaged and dilapidated line rooms were re-roofed, utilizing 11.7 million rupees from Ministry funds and 3.7 million rupees contributed by Regional Plantation Companies.

A significant highlight of our 2024 initiatives was the implementation of large-scale water supply projects under the Water and Sanitation Improvement Project (WaSSIP) in Nuwara Eliya, Hatton, Badulla, and Ratnapura. These projects have been instrumental in providing clean, safe, and sustainable water access to estate communities, addressing longstanding issues related to water scarcity and sanitation.

Under Phase - I of the World Bank-funded program, 4,587 households were covered. with an expenditure of 916.4 million rupees. In Phase -II, 2,760 households were covered, with an expenditure of 1,402.5 million rupees. Furthermore, we successfully renovated 13 medium-scale water supply projects in estate sectors under Phase - II, funded by World Vision Lanka, with an investment of nearly 33 million rupees. These projects have now been fully handed over to the estate community through respective Estate Worker Housing Cooperative Societies (EWHCS), enhancing access to safe drinking water and better sanitation facilities.
