

The purpose of this programme is to educate parents about the child safety, nutrition, sanitation. 20 people participated in this programme.

"Poshana Paye" Programme

This programme is a vital initiative aimed at enhancing the nutritional status of children enrolled in the Child Development Centers (CDC). Through this programme, parents are empowered with knowledge and resources to make choices regarding their children's dietary intake.





Drugs Distribution Programme



Drugs distribution programme was conducted to distribute free grant drugs to facilitate health and nutritional level of Estate children.

Having considered on the safety measures for the children by the estate, the Northland Division CDC was re-opened. The primary purpose of this is to provide basic education to the children. The required guidance and counseling were provided by PHDT, and the support of Plantation management was given for this purpose.









The oral cancer screening programme was conducted to facilitate estate workers to maintain effective oral hygiene practices among the resident estate population, who are carrying out unfavorable health habits such as betel chewing, smoking, etc., and with this programme, estate workers gained the opportunity to check oral cancer and the identified patients were referred to hospitals for further treatments. This programme was conducted with the Regional Dental Surgeon – RDHS Office – Kegalle.

Hygiene kits Distribution Programme

The programme was launched with the support of UNICEF and facilitated by PHDT to improve the health status of plantation children aged 0-5 years.

The programme was implemented with a special Ayurvedic Clinic with a view to focusing on weight management. The clinic provides appropriate solutions to children's weight-related problems by combining traditional Ayurvedic principles with modern nutrition science. Through personalized counseling, dietary recommendations, herbal supplements and lifestyle adjustments were gained.

The aim is to promote weight management, fostering their overall well-being and vitality. This programme was conducted with the Ayurvedic Department – Kegalle and follow up programme are being conducted by the PHDT Health Team.

Awareness Programme on Dengue, disposal of garbage and other public health issues

An Awareness Programme on Dengue and other public health issues were tailored specifically in the plantations with the facilitation of PHDT, Kegalle. Through interactive sessions and informational materials, the residents were educated about the prevention of Dengue fever and the importance of proper garbage disposal in mitigating mosquito breeding grounds. Additionally, PHDT addressed various other public health concerns relevant to the community. By fostering awareness and understanding, our initiative aimed to empower residents to take proactive measures to safeguard their health and enhance the well-being of the entire estate.





Education on prevention of anemia and providing of wormy treatments to Plantation Community

Our program facilitated distribution of 500 mg of mebendazole to our estate residents. Mebendazole is an essential drug for the treatment of common intestinal worm infections in many communities. The programme aims to improve the health and well-being of estate residents by providing access to essential medicines. PHDT Kegalle facilitated this program.

Disaster Management Awareness Programme for Estate Community

PHDT Kegalle organized a disaster management awareness programme to improve disaster preparedness among our estate community. The initiative aims to educate residents about various potential hazards and equip them with practical knowledge and skills to mitigate risks and respond effectively to emergencies. Through interactive workshops, training sessions and information materials, participants were briefed on evacuation procedures, first aid measures and strategies to protect property and life.



Community Home Gardening Awareness Programme & Distribution of Vegetable Seeds





The aim is to empower residents with the knowledge and skills needed to cultivate and effectively manage household finances. From growing nutritious produce to budgeting wisely, the programme provides participants with practical knowledge to enhance their well-being and sustainability. PHDT Kegalle facilitated this programme.

Ayurvedic Health Camp for Adults at Doteloya Estate

An Ayurvedic health camp was organized for the elderly people in the plantation sector and this camp not only provides consultations with Ayurvedic doctors but also provides access to essential Ayurvedic medicines with the assurance that those in need had access to appropriate medicines to address their specific health concerns. Additionally, PHDT directed individuals to attend Ayurvedic clinics, where they were also given ongoing treatment and guidance for their well-being. Our programme aimed to empower individuals to embrace the principles of Ayurveda for their well-being. This program was conducted with the Ayurvedic Department – Kegalle which is being followed up by PHDT Health Team.
